You have probably heard of noise cancelling headphones, but noise cancelling roadways? Sounds like the stuff of science fiction. However, if you have driven along Genesee Avenue lately, you may have seen Mid Coast Corridor Transit (Mid Coast) project related construction work being done to widen the road and install just that...road surfaces that are less noisy. While not exactly eliminating roadway noise, the asphalt concrete material being installed by the MCTC subcontractor Romero General Construction (RGC) is generally soft and mildly flexible which compacts slightly when vehicles drive over it. For this reason, asphalt concrete road surfaces tend to generate less roadway noise than other road surfaces, which is a good thing.

RGC utilize Asphalt Pavers to lay down the asphalt concrete on the ground, and complete minor compaction to the necessary grade. The result is ultimately a smooth, extended pathway that provides an additional lane for vehicles to use and helps improve the flow of traffic. Now hit the road and try out your newly improved, and quieter, drive through Genesee Avenue!

Qualifications of DBE:

A DBE certification can help a business on their road to success. So how does a business know if they qualify for DBE certification? If your firm answers YES to all of the below questions, then you may be DBE qualified:

- 51% owned by a disadvantage individual (e.g. minority or female individuals)
- Owner(s) net worth is less than \$1.32M
- A firm is a small business (as defined by the SBA)
- Firm does not average gross receipts for past three years greater than \$22.41M
